

RESOLUTION NO. 663

WHEREAS, Ray Moore, Senator from the 36th Legislative District, served with distinction in the Washington State Senate from 1979 until 1994; and

WHEREAS, Ray Moore was a dedicated public servant, a champion of the poor and the most vulnerable citizens of Washington;

WHEREAS, Ray Moore's immeasurable impact on the community is reflected in the Queen Anne Lifeline Foodbank and the Queen Anne Helpline;

WHEREAS, Ray Moore's leadership was also reflected in his work with the Washington Mental Health Association and as a member of the President's Civil Rights Advisory Commission; and

WHEREAS, Ray Moore's initial recommendation and continued efforts for the funding and creation of a pedestrian bridge linking the Queen Anne and Lake Union neighborhoods in Seattle culminated in the construction of a pedestrian bridge across State Route 99 at Galer Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington State Transportation Commission recognizes the accomplishments and contributions of Ray Moore as a distinguished representative of the people of Washington State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Washington State Transportation Commission expresses its appreciation to, and respect for, Ray Moore by naming the Galer Avenue Pedestrian Bridge the "Ray Moore Bridge", and directs the Department of Transportation to provide signing so that future generations will remember the exemplary public service he shared with all of us.
