The Price of Service

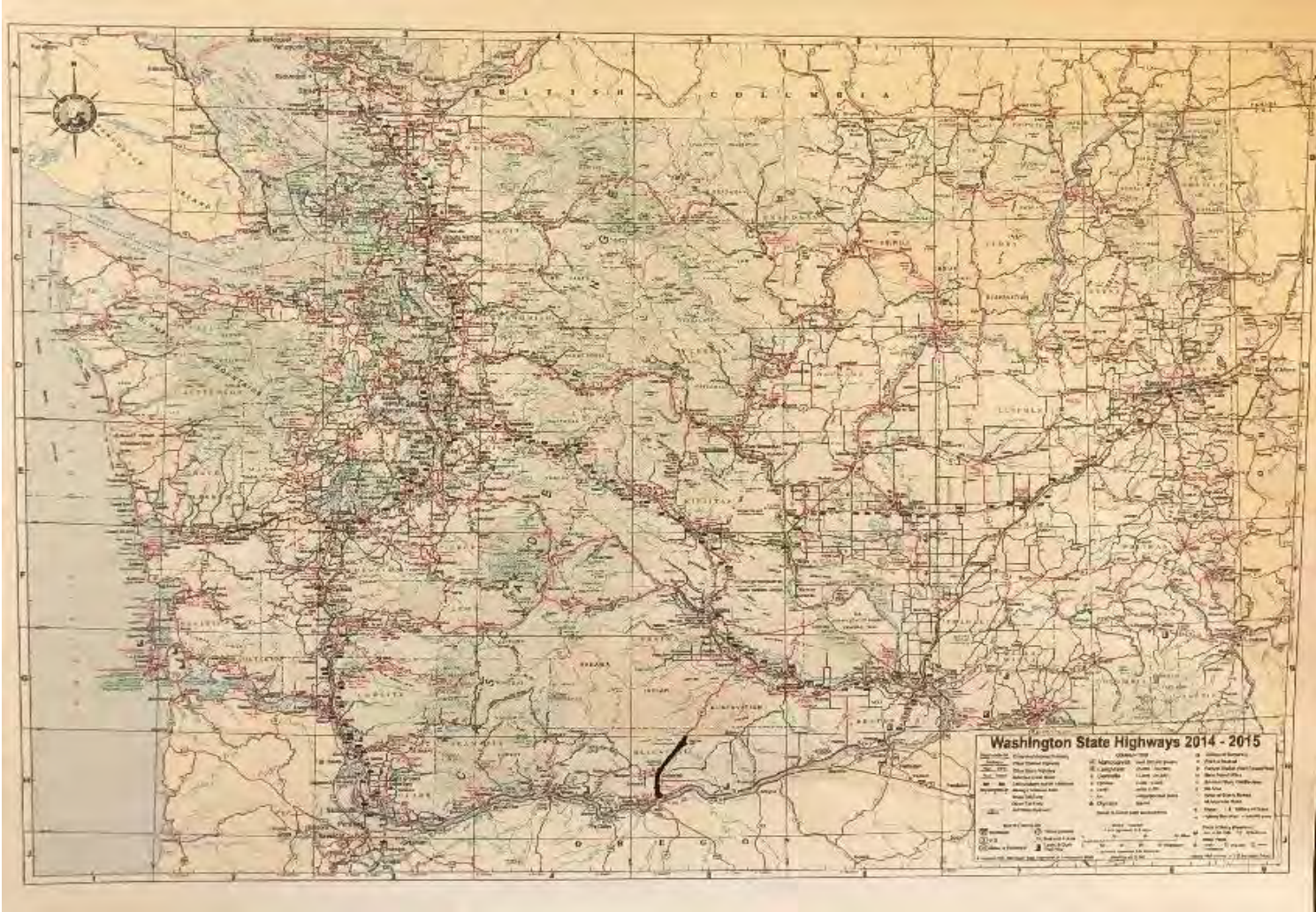


- From the US, Sixteen Million served
- 407,316 Died
- Of the 1.7 million Washington residents in 1940, Over 3900 died as a result of service
- In 1940, there were about 11,400 citizens in Klickitat County.
- 51 died serving in World War II
- About 10 remain for the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II

US 97 in Klickitat County

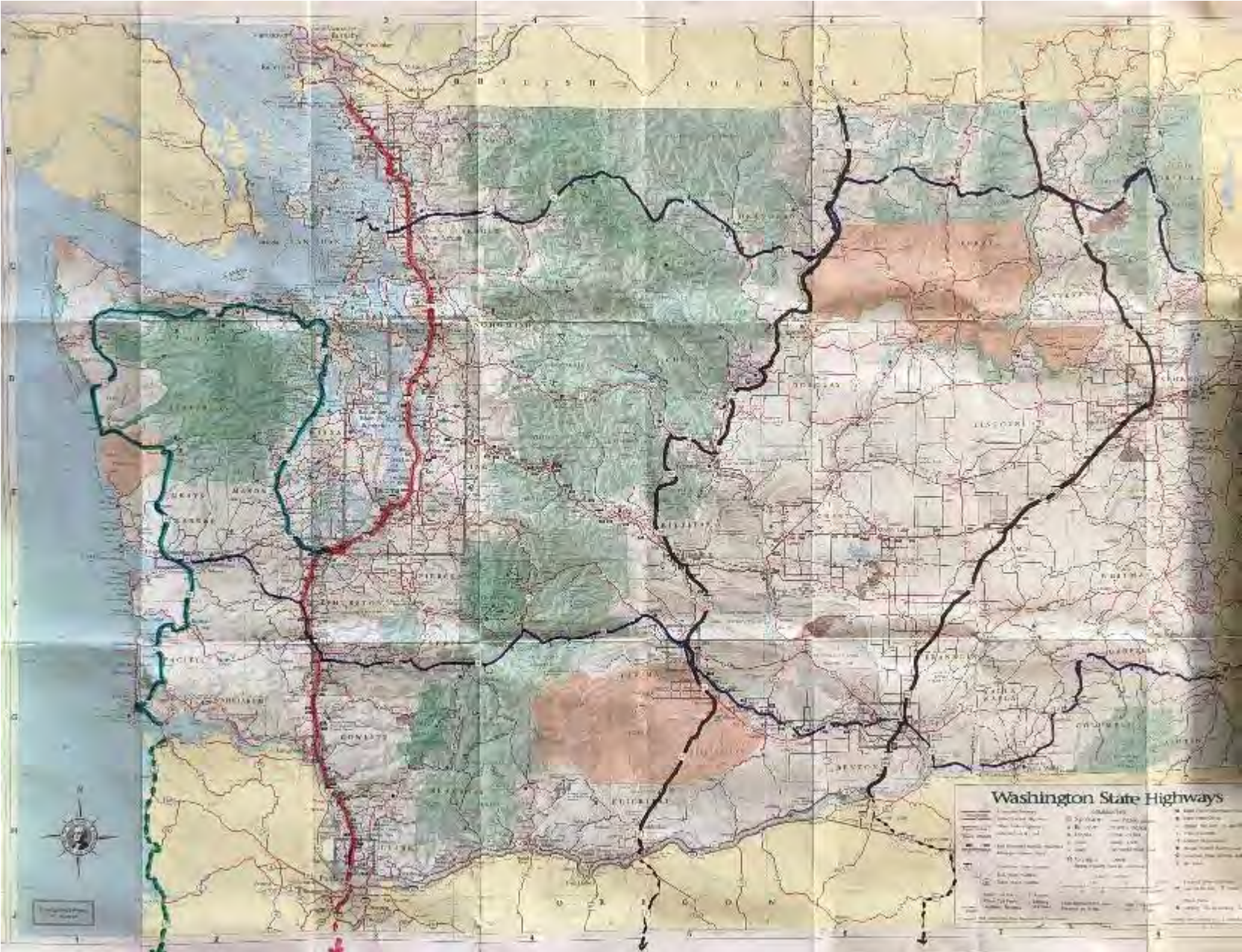


US 97 in Washington State

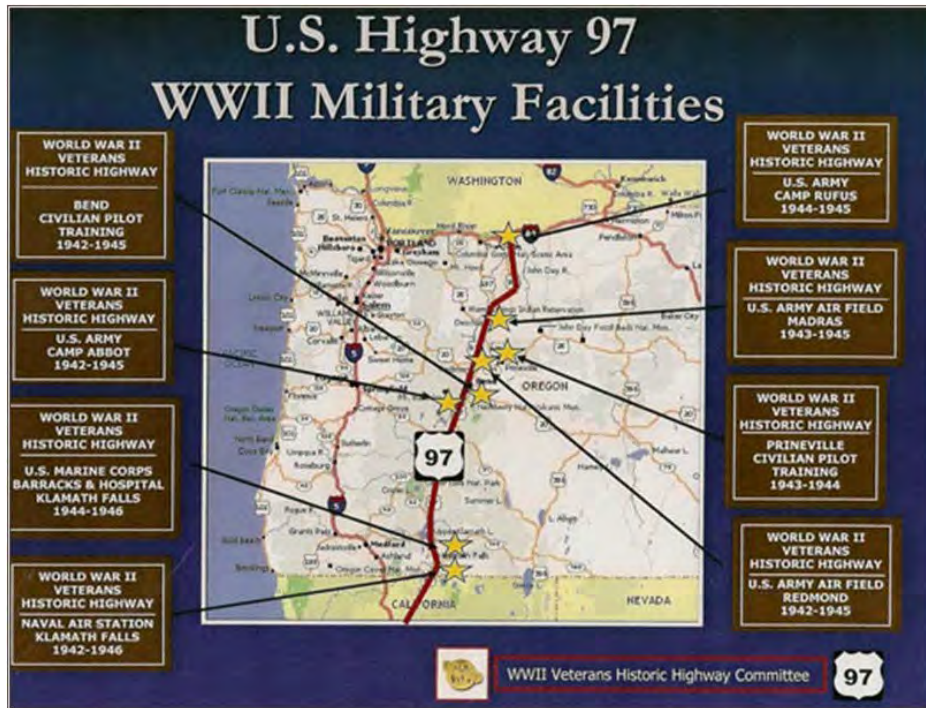


Oregon Veterans Memorial Highways





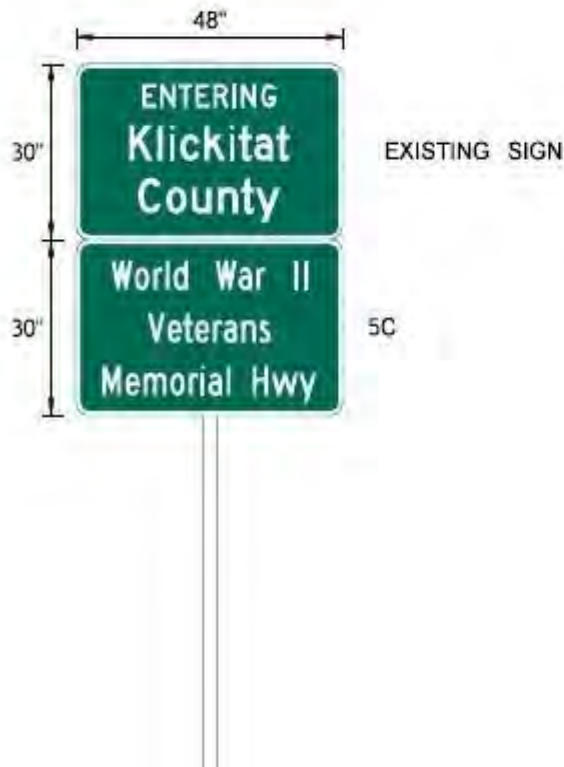
Oregon's Recognition of World War II
