# WHY TRAIL PLAN?

- During Palouse 2040 Plan preparation- Overwhelming majority asked to invest in the trail and bike path development on the Palouse.
- More than 400 responders asked to improve trails, bike lanes, and alternate transportation modes as the first investment priority in the region.
- Transportation is changing- Community is asking for investments that increases safety, health and more.. Not just highways and roads
  - In the past few years- region is working on following trail improvements:
    - Railbanking Colfax- Albion- Pullman Trail
    - Colton-Uniontown Trail
    - Bill- Chipman Trail
    - Dayton- Waitsburg Trail, Blue Mountain Regional Trail
    - Whitman County Residents are asking for trail improvements for the past few years...

# WHAT WILL THIS PLAN DO?

- The plan will create public engagement regarding trail needs and gaps
- Study the existing trails and new needs
- Advocate trail improvements on the Palouse on regional and state level
- Find Gaps
- Research land ownerships
- Estimate trail and bike lane construction costs
- Create a public forum to discuss trail developments
- Gather input through online and public meetings on where the ideal trails would benefit on the Palouse
- Collect Trail usage data
- Create a public website with GIS maps to learn and know everything about the trails on the Palouse

# WHAT WILL THIS PLAN DO?

- The proposed website will guide you to your trail/bike routes, Improve other Active Transportation Needs in the region.
- The PRTPO Board has approved \$54k to study and complete the Trail Plan
- Once the plan is completed, Palouse RTPO will work with local governments to get the projects funded.
- Scope of Work:
  - Plan will be completed in three phases
  - First and third phase will involve public outreach efforts
  - Estimated completion in ~~May~~ Dec 2021 (Delayed due to Covid-19)

- Identified 130+ Regionwide Trail Systems (So far)
- Collecting Data on Sidewalks, Bike lanes,
- Two Trails have completed individual planning efforts- CAP and Touchet Valley Trails
  
- Currently Draft Website With More Than 130 Trails Is Underway
- Virtual Public Meetings Are Scheduled For October 2020
- Public And Stakeholders Surveys- Soon to be collected
- Trail Traffic Count Data Will Be Collected
