Transportation

Provide individuals with special needs transportation to access community resources using door-to-door and fixed-routes.

Annually – over 100,000 trips; over 1 million miles traveled. Waiver to provide delivery of food, prescriptions, and other essentials.



Yakima Transportation

Providing Demand Response, door to door transportation service to individuals that are **elderly (60-years+), persons with disabilities, children with special needs, Veterans, low-income persons and the general public.** Service is provided to those that live outside the city limits of a public transit system and have no other means of transportation.

Fixed-Route Transportation (Fare Free & open to the general public)

- **Community Connector (Rte 200)** travels along the I-82 Corridor from Yakima to Prosser, three times daily, Mon-Fri, 8:06 am – 7:14 pm.
- **Work Express (Rte 202)**, also travels along the I-82 Corridor from Prosser to Yakima. Mon-Fri, 6:15 am – 7:06 pm.
- **Valley Shuttle (Rte 201)** runs between the cities of Mabton, Grandview and Sunnyside. Mon-Fri, 8:31am – 3:55 pm.

Adams, Lincoln, Grant, Chelan, & Douglas Counties Transportation



Demand Response door-to-door services to individuals who do not have access to transportation or have a special need.

Grant Transit (GTA) ADA services are provided to ADA certified individuals with a disability that cannot use GTA fixed route services.

Link Transit DAR supplemental fixed-route services are provided to residents of Chelan & Douglas counties.

- **Route 100** Moses Lake, Ephrata, Quincy, and Wenatchee
Mon-Fri, 7:45 am – 5:30 pm.
- **Route 101** Coulee Dam, Grand Coulee, Wilbur, Creston, and Davenport with service to Spokane Mon-Fri, 7:30am – 7:00 pm.
- **Route 102** Othello, Connell, Mesa, & Tri-Cities Mon-Fri, 8:15am – 4:50 pm
- **Route 104** Othello, Warden, & Moses Lake Mon-Fri, 7:00am – 6:55 pm.
